Baltimore is now Stream Recycling--All items collected in one container. Instead of separating your bottles, cans, jars and paper, you can now place all these items in one container for collection. Your paper collection day last year is now the collection day for all your recyclables. DPW has also added more varieties of plastics which they will accept. Plastic bottles and jars with 1-7 on the bottom, instead of just 1-2, will now be collected.

Trash: every Wednesday

Recycling: every Friday.

Bulk Trash: Call 410-361-9333 three working days before the regular scheduled pick up day, which is the 4th Wed. of the month.

Recently, Baltimore City Public School's grounds crew removed a derelict softball backstop, two dug outs, and approximately 150 ft. of fencing along Woodheights Ave. The Department of Forestry will plant approximately 20 street trees along Woodheights Ave. as part of the TreeMedfield Initiative.
