BALTIMORE CITY'S ANTI-ANIMAL ABUSE ADVISORY COMMISSION

One of Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake initiatives places increased visibility on the abuse of animals in our city. The commission is charged with providing recommendations for ways to eliminate animal abuse. They will also conduct research into methods for reducing dog fighting, increase awareness of animal cruelty laws, and improving training techniques for law enforcement officials. NORTHERN DISTRICT CRIME STATISTICS

As of Sept. 21, 2011, Northern District (ND Baltimore City has had 5 fewer homicides and 19 fewer shootings than this time in 2010. ND has had 3 homicides to date, down 25% from this time in 2010. Robberies are down 7%, violent crime down 10%, and property crime is down 13%.

Due to new university students arriving in the area, who fail to secure their property, police anticipate a surge in property crime. REMEMBER: lock your residences and vehicles, DO NOT leave property (laptops, GPSs, cell phones, cameras, etc.) visible! Most importantly stay informed!
